### THE HEADMASTER

#### Just Let It Go

I read the following to the students at the College Assembly for the Presentation of the Winter Sports Firsts Teams and Winter Sports & Activities Captains and would like to share it with you.

When we say "just let it go" we usually mean "get over it". It's not a helpful thing to say as most of us really do want to let go of painful thoughts or experiences, but don't know how to.

Life teaches us that many of the things that cause us the most worry never in fact happen. When we do have real problems, worrying is probably the least effective way of dealing with them.

The Dalai Lama gives this advice: "If you have some fear of pain or suffering (or tests or exams), you should examine whether there is anything you can do about it. If you can, there is no need to worry about it. If you cannot, then there is also no need to worry."

Let it go; get over it; whatever. These are unhelpful things to say – to your friends or to yourself. It is much more productive to take the advice of the Dalai Lama and write down what you can do. Then do it. If there is nothing to be done, try to train your mind to stop worrying.

#### In other words, fix it or forget it.

Try these proven ways to fix your worries.

1. Trust yourself. Think of the times you worried but got through. Or what you worried about never happened.
2. Prepare for the worst. Is the worst thing that can happen really all that bad? Is the worst likely to happen at all?
3. Hope for the best. People with an optimistic attitude often find life works out well for them.
4. Write down your worries. Then take the next step and write down one or two actions you can take to solve your problem.
5. Get help. Talking about your worries to someone who is a good listener can help you find a way out.
6. Keep busy. One of the best ways to stop worrying is to find a way to help others.

At the conclusion of her speech, Sr Farrell presented Br Leary with a copy of her uncle's war diary. Sister Farrell's Uncle, James Lynch graduated from Waverley College in 1929. After becoming a Barrister, James Lynch fought for his country in WW2. He was a Prisoner of War at Changi and died age 31 from cerebral malaria. This diary, which can also be found in the War Memorial in Canberra, is now in our College Library.

The ceremony provided the chance to not only to honour our Blessed Mother but also to recognise the important role that mothers play in the lives of all of us. I would like to thank all those who contributed so willingly in helping to make the 99th Annual May Procession such a special event.
