CYCLING

Waverley College was represented at the Australian Schools Cycling Cup by Year 9 student Patrick Sharpe, who travelled down to the competition venue in Dookie near Shepparton, Victoria to compete in the Road Cycling Events (Junior Male 8km Individual Time Trial (ITT) and the 23.4km Road Race). Both events were held on Wednesday, 1 April, with the Road Race in the morning and the Time Trial in the afternoon.

The field had almost doubled in the Cup's first year away from Melbourne with almost 500 riders competing across Road and MTB disciplines. There were some Australian junior team representatives in a strong field.

Patrick was very competitive in both his events. In the Road Race he placed 7th out of 71 racers in a time of 38:47, just 44 seconds behind the winner. In the ITT, Patrick again placed 7th out of 75 finishers in a time of 14:52, just 77 seconds behind the winner.

These were great results and significantly Patrick was able to ride Waverley College into 12th place out of 31 teams that competed in the Junior Males category. Not bad since there was no Team Time Trial Result for the school. Congratulations to Patrick Sharpe on his excellent achievement in a very competitive event.

PARENTS & FRIENDS

What Happened in the last week's P & F Meeting:

- The P & F Executive introduced a set of amendments to our outdated Constitution (last updated in 1983), together with draft Meeting Procedures. After discussion, certain modifications were made and these modified documents will be published on the P & F homepage one month ahead of the next meeting, which will be a Special Meeting called to consider and vote on the resolution to adopt the changes (unless further amendments are sought). It is clear the P & F Constitution is in need of amendment to reflect modern day practices.
- The Headmaster confirmed that the College was successful in receiving \$200,000 for the senior school as part of the National School Pride Scheme and \$2m from the Federal Government for the Junior School for upgrading the library and creating a new outdoor learning area, modifying the entrance and relocating stairs. Subject to the necessary approvals being fast tracked by the Government it is hoped the works will commence in the near future, with the junior school temporarily relocating to the senior campus whilst works are undertaken.
- "New Years" Functions: As parents resume for a new year in 2010, it has been suggested that there is interest in resurrecting some Year group social functions that help parents to meet others in their "New Year" (hence New Years Function). Those interested in nominating as organisers for their new year group next year please come along to the next P & F Meeting on Tues 11 August at Froebel House, 7.45pm. While the P & F are happy to help subsidise, it can only happen if a few people in each year group volunteer to organise.
- Meeting concluded at 9.20pm and it will be our endeavour to keep meetings to time so that people can budget their time commitment in attending.
