SOCCER

The last game of round 1 was a hard fought classic against 2007 Thomas Grimson Cup winners, Trinity Grammar School and last years reigning premiers Waverley College. Waverley soon regained the lead, Giancarlo Gallifuoco completing his double, rounding the keeper to slot home the game. Waverley showed great temperament and perseverance the hold out a rampant Trinity attack line. This result put Waverley College on the top of the table, leading into round 2 undefeated. The match finishing 1-2.

In the other grades, there were some great results that went our way. The 7As played a great game of football that included some excellent goals. They came away with a 6-2 victory. The 5th XI had a 'goal-fest' against Trinity with a hard fought 4-4 draw.



TENNIS

The Referee Development Programme has developed considerably since its implementation three years ago. Traditionally, Waverley relied heavily on parents and "old-boys" for the provision of referees at Saturday fixtures; however, that parental pool began to diminish drastically when boys graduated from Year Twelve. Thankfully, we have managed to reclaim lost territory.

Our more recent "old-boys", Charles Hartson and Ben Kusayda, regularly referee for NSW and volunteer their time at Waverley at most home fixtures. Brendan Hoskins, who graduated last year, also offers his time to his Alma Mater while also representing his Colts team at Southern Districts.

We are also fortunate to have access to "less recent old boys" who are senior NSW referees and referee coaches. These men offer their expertise and time to assist in developing our schoolboy referees. On Saturday, Costa Georgiadis – a regular face at Queens Park - spent the entire morning appraising and advising three boys who are preparing for their transition from cadet referees to full NSW accreditation: they are Nathan Stone, Jack McCarthy and Edward Hartson. Besides having to referee games at Queens Park, each boy then went to Trinity to represent their respective rugby teams in the afternoon. Their contributions are greatly appreciated.

These boys are among a total of nineteen who are currently in the development programme. Six out of the group earned their NSW accreditation last year and continue to referee before or after their own team commitments on Saturdays. These young men have gained invaluable experience with regards to pressure and making committed decisions while under the spotlight.

Lastly, I would like to wish our cadet referees the best of luck in their field-testing and their attainment of NSW accreditation.
