**Ms D Grigson - DHM Curriculum****Former Student Advice**

Last Thursday, the HSC Class of 2009 welcomed back six graduates from the HSC Class of 2008 for a question and answer session. The 2009 Class enjoyed hearing about techniques and their strategies used to cope with the Higher School Certificate.

The Dux of the College, Jake Wilson, together with one of the Vice-Captains of the College, Sean Conroy and Ethan Tuxford, Benjamin Forrest, Dominic D'Adam and Atticus Saunders gave an insight to how they coped with the demands of school life and the pressure of the HSC. Each former student gave invaluable advice about the techniques they used to cope with stress, Assessment Tasks, note making, studying, and examination techniques to name just a few.

The session highlighted the importance to students the necessity to be pro-active for their academic success. All former students stressed the importance of taking charge of their actions now, to ensure success in the future. They discussed the importance of Assessment Tasks and the necessity to start them as soon as possible, as the marks earned for the tasks are, "... like money in the bank." said Jake. They also pushed the importance of a balanced lifestyle, focussing around academic work. Each student discussed their technique and all stated that it was important to remain on top of their studies by "... doing as many hours as it takes, sometimes more that three or four hours per night" remarked Atticus.

At the conclusion of this session, all students should have received their Assessment Task schedule for the remainder of the year. **CRICKET****Round 6 v Barker**

The day began with Waverley College in the field. Spinner Matthew Pulella surprised the Barker team by taking the new ball. This produced a wicket in the 4th over with a good catch by Charlie Wakim. Oliver Newling threw down the stumps from gully to have Barker at 2 for 19. Lloyd Jones hit the stumps with his 1st ball and then in his 2nd over picked up 2 more wickets, both caught by Charlie Wakim at short cover. Waverley College was on top with Barker 5 for 43. A dropped catch in the gully began a disappointing period for the team. 7 catches in all were grassed and at the end of 50 overs Barker had made a respectable 9 for 206. The Waverley College chase began in the worst possible manner.

Both openers, Matthew Strikes and Nicholas Stapleton, were back in the rooms with out a run on the board. Oliver Newling followed soon after for 1 and then Charlie Wakim was caught brilliantly low down at gully. When Darcy Matthews and Matthew Puella followed the total was 6 for 36. Daniel Kitto and Jack Wallace began to form a partnership until Daniel Kitto played around one and was bowled. Aidan Anderson played an aggressive innings of 21 and Lloyd Jones saw the total past 100. However when Luke Conolly was run out for 0, Waverley College had been bowled out for just 115. Jack Wallace batted very well for his 38 not out but the team had only batted for 37 overs of the possible 50. A very disappointing day.

### Around the Grounds

The 2nd XI had a very fine win in the heat at Barker. Batting first, in a 30 over game, Waverley College finished the overs at 8 for 98, Harrison Tagg with 38 the best with the bat. In the field Waverley College strangled the Barker batting making runs very hard to come by. Harrison Tagg picked up a couple of wickets for a good all round performance. The 3rd XI went down. They were never up to the run chase.

The 10A's found the going tough. Barker batted very well to be 1 for 187 at the completion of the innings. Waverley College tried hard but fell well short to be 4 for 125. The 9A's bowled first and restricted Barker to 5 for 163. Ryan Faulkner-Hogg picking up 2 wickets. Dean Jones, 52, was the only contributor with the bat and Waverley College was out for 123. The 8A's fought hard totaling 127 with Logan Chan scoring 37. Barker passed the total for the loss of 4 wickets with 4 overs to spare. The 8D's posted 4 for 93 in their 20/20 match with Patrick McGuin reaching 30 before being retired, Liam Grady made 16 not out. Barker passed the total losing 2 wickets but with only 2 overs remaining. The 8E's went all the way to Barker only for the Barker team not to turn up. A side was put together and all had fun. The 7A's bowled first and Barker totaled 4 for 207 with Connor O'Shea returning 2 for 15. In reply Waverley College was bowled out for 123 with Connor O'Shea hitting 55.
