Zimbabwe Street Soccer Carnival – Sunday 16th August

6 students represented the College – led by Year 11 student Michael Wood and assisted by Mrs Cullen at the Zimbabwe Street Soccer Carnival which was held at Hordern Oval, Cranbrook School last Sunday.

The Cranbrook Football community have helped 9 Zimbabwe soccer players seek asylum in Australia and they now have been granted permanent residency. The Cranbrook community have been housing them in their homes for the past 18 months. They are now trying to raise enough money to bring their families to Australia to begin a new life away from their horrific circumstances in Zimbabwe. Sunday was their major fund-raising event. All involved had a great time in support of raising money for a tremendous cause.

It was in essence a grand-final match – the last game of the season; both teams tied on points at the top of the table. The pressure and nerves were running deep on both sides, with everyone expecting a match of the highest quality. It did not disappoint.

As defending Champions, Waverley came out guns blazing to grab the early advantage in front of a record crowd at QP2. They did so though the unlikely goal-scorer of Martin Kastengren, centre defender, who struck a powerful shot into the bottom corner after strong build-up play by the Waverley attack.

Not long after, the lead was doubled by Thomas Scarf, team captain, as he volleyed an in-swinging free kick by Giancarlo Gallifuoco outside the box to place the ball in the top corner – out of the keeper's reach. 2-0 up going into half-time and it was almost too good to be true.

However, barely a minute after kick-off, Trinity had halved the deficit, catching the defence still sluggish from the break. Waverley sought to bounce back, striking the woodwork several times and forcing the best out of the Trinity defence, but it worked to the contrary as the match drew level with a Trinity equaliser midway through the second half.

A draw would see both sides win in a joint premiership, but this was clearly not an option for either team. With both teams pushing for the winner, it came down to "The X-Factor" - Massimo Luongo - to settle the match, as he cracked it from outside the box into the bottom corner, sending the hill – overflowing with supporters – into hysterics.

It ended as the match it was hyped up to be; a thriller, with Waverley eventually keeping the title of CAS Premiers, retaining what they also won last year. The team did the school proud and proved itself as a dominate force in CAS football.
