SAC Round 8 - 1st XI

Nicholas Stapleton contributed 33. The start crumbled rapidly as Matthew Sarkies 19, Oliver Newling 12, Darcy Matthews 11, Matthew Pulella 1 and Daniel Kitto 0 had Waverley College at 6 for 101 off 29 overs. Jack Wallace 27, joined Charlie Wakim and this pair carried the total to 171 before Jack Wallace was out. This brought Aidan Anderson to the crease. In the space of just 5 overs this pair belted the attack everywhere. The score stood at 7 for 222 with just 4 overs remaining. Charlie Wakim then fell for 83. What followed was some power hitting from Aidan Anderson. The next 4 overs yielded 48 runs, of which Lloyd Jones contributed just 4. Aidan Anderson hit 7 sixes and 2 fours in his unbeaten 62, a truly memorable innings. This saw Waverley College finish the 49 overs with a total of 8 for 270. In the field Waverley College proved just as potent. Darcy Matthews started the procession with a direct hit in the 4th over. Luke Connolly then found his line producing a wicket with a good catch by Jack Wallace and suddenly, an over later, he was on a hat trick with a catch to Charlie Wakim and then hitting the stumps next ball. Unfortunately he missed the achievement but finished the day with 3 for 19. Aidan Anderson then chipped in with a smart catch to Matthew Pulella at slip and then hitting middle stump. He finished the day with 2 for 10. This had SAC at 22 off 10 overs. Jack Wallace was introduced and had immediate success with a

glove through to keeper Matthew Sarkies. He picked up the 8th wicket hitting middle stump and finished with 2 for 13. Matthew Pulella, not to be out done hit the stumps for the final 2 wickets finishing with 2 for 15 and Waverley College had achieved the 1st victory of the season. CYCLING

Waverley College Cycling at NSW Interschools 2009

The Waverley College Cycling Team competed at the NSW MTB Interschools held at Thebabo from the morning of Friday 21 February until the afternoon of Sunday 22 February over three disciplines: 4X, Downhill (DH) and Cross Country XC.

4X involves 4 riders competing over a short dirt course with jumps and tight corners (berms), keeping within gates along the way. The first 2 riders progress to the next round until a final four compete for podium places. Downhill is on the famous Cannonball run that falls 600m in 3.8km where riders must negotiate high speed jumps and rocks and corners on a final timed run. Cross Country is held over various numbers of laps (depending on age) of a course involving sharp rises and falls on mostly single dirt track and tests skills and endurance.

The team was Myles Briguglio (Division 3), Andrew Weetman (Division 2) and Matthew Weetman (Division 1). All boys competed in all events in a committed and enthusiastic manner that was a credit to the school. All boys accumulated King of the Mountain (KOM) points during the event, which is based on the performance in all events. KOM decides the best overall rider.

Myles Briguglio in Division 3 was unlucky to crash in 4X after contacting another rider. Myles recovered to compete creditably in the DH (42nd out of 57) on a hard tail bike (most are dual suspension) and backed up to come 32nd out of 50 in XC.

Andrew Weetman made the second round of 4X and then completed a great timed lap in DH (about 7:44) to come 62nd out of 137, and backed up to complete 3 tough laps of the XC coming 33rd out of about 80 in XC.

Matthew Weetman made the second round of 4X. He was obviously saving himself because he had a fabulous run in DH (about 6:26), coming 2nd and beating many sponsored and coached riders in that event. Matthew backed up and came 11th in the XC the next day over 4 laps (about 75 minutes racing); another great result.

Unfortunately KOM results weren't available at the time of this report. A special thank you to Ms. Anderson and the senior boys who helped supervise the rest of the team in Centennial Park on Saturday. The Meet on 28 February is at Heffron Park, warm up starts at 8.30am.
